Quintin Beazer, Ph.D.

The Rule of Law in Kazakhstan

Professor Beazer is an associate professor of political science at Florida State University. He is also an associate fellow at the International Center for the Study of Institutions and Development at the Higher School of Economics in Moscow. Professor Beazer will provide cultural information about Kazakhstan in advance of the arrival of the Open World Delegation.

Dr. Beazer studies comparative and international political economy and authoritarian politics, with specialization in the politics of Russia and the post-communist countries.

Beazer's research examines how politics and economics interact in "messy" environments where institutions are weak, in transition, or non democratic.

Dr. Beazer obtained his Bachelor of Arts in International Studies and English at Utah State University, then continued on to Masters of Arts in Political Science and Economics at The Ohio State University, followed by a Ph.D in Political Science.

Professor Beazer's research has been published in the *American Journal* of *Political Science* and the *Journal of Politics*.


